

## Holiday Club @ Home Overview

### About

Welcome to Surrey Chapel's At-Home Holiday Club!

As you might know, we were going to be running an Easter Holiday Club at our church in the holidays, which has had to be postponed for the time being.

However, we have created a version of Holiday Club for you guys to do from the comfort of your own homes!

This is on a different theme than our Easter one would have been – we are focusing on the story of Jesus calming the storm, found in Mark 4:35-41. We will see from this how Jesus was, is and always will be in control, even with COVID-19.

We hope that this version of Holiday Club will provide your families with some new and different activities to do while at home. We have aimed to provide around an hour and a half worth of 'stuff'.

Please briefly read the following before getting started, so it all makes a little more sense!


### What you need to know

This Holiday Club has 3 sessions – it is up to you and your family how you might want to run these. You may prefer to do one session each on consecutive days or do all 3 in one day or even spread them out over a few weeks – whatever works for you.

You can pick and choose which activities, crafts and games you'd like to do – if you'd like to do absolutely everything, that's great! If you'd like to pick just one craft from each day, that's great too. Everything you need can be found here:

The videos for each session include the story, songs, game suggestions and an explanation of the crafts. It would probably work best if you pause the video throughout to complete the different activities as you go along.



Each day there are some activities to do in a little booklet; it's probably easiest to print the booklet out for each child and they can complete it with each session.

## Sessions

Each session runs along these lines:

- Introduction
- Game/challenge
- Song
- Story/talk
  - Memory verse and prayer included
- Game/challenge
- Song x2
- Explanation of crafts and activity books

For each session, there'll also be an overview explaining what the main points, songs, crafts and activities are (as well as any resources needed).

As well as the crafts, there's also an optional extra task of creating a different part of a boat in each session (the base, the sail and the passengers). At the end of the sessions, the children can see if their boats float!

Finally, there are two different activity books: one for Key Stage 1 children (ages 4-7) and one for Key Stage 2 children (ages 7-11).

## Over to you!

We hope this all makes sense and is an enjoyable time for you. We've tried to make it as straightforward to access as possible, to make less work for you at home, but please let us know if we can do anything else.
